What is TED?

Every year, two TED Conferences invite the world's leading thinkers and doers to speak for 18 minutes on a diverse mix of topics. What About TEDx?

In the spirit of ideas worth spreading, TEDx is a program of local, self-organized events that bring people together to spread ideas and to have an experience that is similar to the official Ted events. At a TEDx event, TEDTalks video are combined with live to spark deep discussion and connection. These local events are branded TEDx, with the "X" meaning independently organized. So individual TEDx events are self-organized by local people, which gives opportunity for more events and more sharing of ideas, even in BC!



An Opportunity for BC Youth In Annual TEDxKids@BC





2014 - 2016 speakers included:

• Veronika C. – The Juice Box Project - Through growing her popular Juice Box recycling program at her school, Veronika inspired others to join her in raising funds to sponsor over 50 wheelchairs for children with disabilities in Guatemala. In 2013, Veronika was invited to travel to Guatemala to learn more about the people and region, and see the impact of her project on the wheelchair recipients.

- Ashley P.T. "Mistakes Should Be Celebrated" This talk was about how making mistakes is a part of life. Most people hate making mistakes because they are afraid to feel embarrassed or appear silly, but experimenting and making mistakes is vital to personal growth, learning and progress. Ashley is extremely interested in world affairs and global politics because she loves understanding how the world around her works. In her spare time, Ashley competes in speech and debate and travels to different places to do so.
- Noah D Noah's talk "Kids Can Too" is all about how he started a business at a ripe age of 7. He gave insight into his business of making new crayons from old crayons and shared how he sells them online, at craft fairs, and in local stores. Noah reminded everyone that anything is possible, at any age. He also hoped to remind everyone that you just have to look for opportunities and not to be scared of failure.
- Albert C Albert is the founder of the Tech Easy Foundation, a local non-profit organization aimed to teach seniors about technology. He spoke about connecting seniors with technology and youth, by sharing his story of how he got involved with the senior community and what he learned along the way.
- Emma and Andrew Emma and Andrew's talk, "Generation Millennials," addressed some of the harmful stereotypes that the youth generation has acquired in the past years. Performed using spoken word poetry, they offered new perspectives on today's youth and their untapped potential for greatness.
