Learning Guides

In the process of learning, you will be given opportunities to practise, make mistakes, and learn. These opportunities will be in your Learning Guide. Your home facilitator may help you and ask you to correct or expand on items in your Learning Guide. Always put your best effort into your *Learning Guide*; it will be marked on a rubric (a chart with grading), based on **Ideas and Content** (detail, deeper thinking, directions followed carefully), **Conventions** (Complete sentences, attention to grammar and spelling, evidence of revisions / corrections / review of work), and **Completeness**. (Student has completed all of the assigned work. It has obviously been reviewed with the home facilitator, edited, etc.)

Resources:

There is NO textbook required for this course. You will need a novel for this course – either Bridge to Terabithia, Mrs. Frisby and the Rats of NIMH, or a novel of choice.

Keys to Success:

- 1. Set a schedule so that you are working on English language arts either everyday or every second day. There should be no big gaps with the hope of catching up. This is VERY important!
