Course Outline

Course Layout The course is broken down into units and organized as follows:

Unit	Topics
1. Impressions	Core competency focus: Communication Text Focus: Descriptive Text Theme: Exploring Sense of Place
2. Tell a Story	Core competency focus: Positive Personal and Cultural Identity Text Focus: Fiction – Elements of Stories Theme: Identity through Stories
3 . Inform and Explain	Core competency focus: Social Responsibility Text Focus: Non-Fiction Text Theme: Contributing to Community and Caring for the Environment
4. Poetry	Core competencies focus: Creative and Critical Thinking Text Focus: Poetry, Essay Writing Theme: Can Poetry Change the World?
5. Novel Study	Core competency focus: Personal Awareness and Responsibility Text Focus: Novels Theme: Depends on novel. Core competency theme: Characters with strong personal awareness and responsibility demonstrate self-respect and express a sense of personal well-being.

The activities in this course are based on the core competencies and curricular learning standards as provided by the Ministry of Education of BC.

Resources:

All resources except for the novel are provided within the course. Students will need good access to the Internet and will be required to use some online tools. There is NO textbook required for this course. You will need to provide a novel for your novel study – either Hatchet by Gary Paulsen or a novel of choice. Ask your teacher if the school has a copy for you.
