

Course Layout: The course is broken down into units and organized using the Big Ideas as follows:

Introductory Unit – Mapping Skills

Big Idea #1 – Systems of Government - Systems of government vary in their respect for human rights and freedoms.

Big Idea #2 – Social Responsibility – Conflicts - People and Government - Economic selfinterest can be a significant cause of conflict among peoples and governments.

Big Idea #3 – Thinking Globally - Global Issues and International Cooperation – Complex global problems require international cooperation to make difficult choices for the future.

Big Idea #4 – Media – Media sources can both positively and negatively affect our understanding of important events and issues.
