


Inquiry Question

Background

In this unit we looked at how racism and environmental damage meet up to create a double hit of oppression in the form of environmental racism. This is your chance to dig deeper into how environmental racism has affected, and is still affecting, Indigenous people. You can focus on Canadian Indigenous peoples, or choose to look at how other Indigenous peoples around the world are affected by environmental racism.

Instructions

- 1. Research how Indigenous peoples are experiencing environmental racism
- 2. Remember that a "to what extent" argument is asking you to choose "how much" not at all, a little, somewhat, a lot, significantly? Back up your argument with examples.
